SUMMARY OF NEW FINDINGS OF THE Ph. D THESIS

The thesis is a comprehensive, insightful and organizational research paper about the activities of the specialized agencies of People's Committee in time of innovation and international integration in contemporary Vietnam.

On the basis of studying scientific perspectives, arguments about innovating organization and activities of the specialized agencies of the People's Committees in the different phases as well as legal practice in Vietnam, the thesis clarified further scientific theory system of specialized agencies of the People's Committee and the rationale for renewing the organization and activities of these agencies, particularly in view of the law. These theoretical issues are the basis for assessing the status and activities of the organization of specialized agencies under the provincial-level People's Committees and People's Committees at district level in our country, as well as a guide for the identification of innovative solutions for organizations and activities of specialized agencies, contributing to the improvement of the organization and activities of the specialized agencies of state administrative agencies in the local government apparatus in Vietnam today.

The thesis analyzed, evaluated comprehensively and deeply regulations of Vietnam's laws on the organization and activities of the specialized agencies and in-practice organizations, operations, activities of the specialized agencies of the provincial and district level People's Committee in our country in recent years. From these studies the thesis clearly stated theoretical issues of concepts, characteristics, location, nature, functions and relationships as well as the development of the specialized agencies of People's committees. The thesis also indicated that the nature of the specialized agencies is to assist the provinciallevel People's Committees in performing the function of management in sectors and fields locally. The thesis also explained concepts, objectives, principles, and factors affecting the innovation of the organization and activities of these agencies.

In the research contents, the thesis analyzed the status of the organization and activities of the specialized agencies of the People's Committee pre and post-period of the renovation. On that basis, it pointed out advantages, and limitations in activities and organizations of specialized agencies. Particularly, it is the limitations in the lack of unity, unclear function, which were not suitable for each level of government (rural, urban, district and provincial level). Moreover, the staff is inefficient (in terms of training, skills...).

Simultaneously, the thesis also proposed and explained a number of important measures to continue reforming the organizations and activities of the specialized agencies of People's Committees at present and in years to come. Specifically: condense structure, organization; define functions and responsibilities of specialized agencies in rural government and municipal governments more clearly. In terms of operation, the thesis mentioned quite comprehensively and thoroughly forms and methods and operating procedures of the specialized agencies, the renewal of responsibility, working style of the staff, civil servants and state employees in these agencies.

The theoretical and practical basis and solutions to organization and operation of the specialized agencies of the People's Committee are based on scientific and practical bases, which are consistent with the guidelines and policies of the Party about administrative reform and building the socialist law-governed Vietnam, to meet the requirements of international integration in our country today.
